



What Has Been Going On?




- In 2021, the Anti-Abuse WG approached us
- The request was to create a training for LIRs that do not know about abuse handling
- In 2022, we developed a webinar
- In 2023, we started delivering the webinar, receiving good feedback



Current Solution: Webinar



- Faster to develop
- Real-time Q&A, discussion and feedback
- Direct networking opportunities
- Trainer facilitates discussion



The Downside...



- Time zone differences
- The content is only delivered once
- Reaching a wider audience would require more live sessions and resources



Suggestion for the Future: E-learning



- Self-paced learning fits schedules
- Online removes geographic barriers
- Content ensures consistent training
- Analytics track completion rates
- Scalable, cost-effective training
- Centralised material updates, no sessions
